

Campus Coordinator Position Description

Children's Hunger Alliance (CHA)

CHA's mission is to break the cycle of childhood hunger and obesity in Ohio's communities.

Key Position Responsibilities

- Serve as Children's Hunger Alliance ambassadors on your campus.
- Build and mobilize a network of students interested and engaged in health, education, hunger, and poverty issues to create and sustain a campus chapter.
- Create campus events and give presentations to educate other students and community members about these issues.
- Manage fundraising and volunteer projects to support CHA in its mission.
- Seek opportunities to expand the presence, outreach, and awareness of CHA and its mission and services to your campus and community.
- Attend monthly meetings with other Campus Coordinators in the Cincinnati and Dayton regions and submit a weekly report of your completed activities and events.
